Accepted Items

Please refer to the lists below to know what is accepted at the Recycling Center. We do not accept commercial quantities of any of the items below.

Recycling Center staff may refuse any of the materials below on a case-by-case basis.

Corrugated Cardboard

Boxes with wavy centers. No wet or moldy cardboard.

Break boxes down flat and stack on edge inside the container.

Batteries

We accept lithium ion or lead acid batteries, but please check with staff before leaving these items at the Recycling Center.

Paperboard

Cereal or cake mix boxes, soft drink cartons, shiny or slick cardboard and phonebooks.

Flatten all containers.

Glass

Food and drink containers only. No light bulbs or ceramics.

Remove caps and lids.

Plastic

Numbers 1-7 only

No plastic bags, film, or styrofoam

No items larger than 2.5 gallons in

Cans

Numbers 1-7 only, aluminum and steel food and beverage containers.

Flatten containers if possible.

Office Paper

Copy paper, letterhead, file folders, junk mail and envelopes.

Magazines, Catalogs + Calendars

Newspapers + Newsprint

Including glossy ads, coupons, and packing paper.

Bag in brown grocery bags, which are available on-site.

Scrap Metal

Steel, aluminum, and other metals. No tanks, electronics, appliances, or paint cans.

Used clothing

If suitable for donation.

Holiday Lights

Accepted in December and January only.

Not Accepted

Recyclespot.org provides information about where you can recycle items we don't accept at the Overland Park recycling center.

Ceramics

Batteries

Alkaline batteries, such as AA, AAA, and D-Cell, can be taken to Midwest Recycling Center for a fee, or safely disposed of with normal household trash.

Electronics

Bring recyclable electronics to the City's <u>Recycling Extravaganza</u> in the spring or fall.

Light Bulbs

Incandescent, fluorescent tube bulbs, compact fluorescent light bulbs, or LEDS.

Plastic Bags

Recycle these at your local grocery store.

Ink + Toner Cartridges

Many office supply stores offer cartridge recycling services.
